## From Deacon Tara

I have always thought that I was pretty good at waiting. But to be honest, this year especially has tested my patience. When will we be able to worship in our building again? When will we have to return to online/virtual worship because the numbers are spiking? Will Pastor Sherri be leaving for Norway soon? The truth is that I cannot control these facts and neither can any of us. So this year, I am incredibly ready for the season of Advent.

Advent is one of my most favorite seasons because it reminds me that God is the one in control. There is just something so incredibly holy about waiting for the birth of the Christ child; this precious infant who is born in a stable, who comes as the light in the midst of darkness, the hope in the midst of despair and the joy in the midst of sorrow. This precious child who reminds us that God loves us so much that God will never leave us or forsake us. God knows us by name and calls and claims us as God's beloved children. As God's beloved children, this year Advent especially reminds us what it means to love our neighbor and cling to God's son who is the light in this dark world. May you cling to the promises of the one who comes to bring light in the midst of darkness.

## Notice of Special Meeting

**COVID Guidelines:** Pastor Sherri distributed a handout regarding church music during COVID; COVID guidelines are available from the END Synod website. Masking was discussed, especially pertaining to lay preachers with vulnerable health; masks are being worn in all churches (some required and some recommended.)

2020 Budget Preparation: All congregations have updated their active confirmed membership lists.

2021 budget proposal was presented. Using the updated active confirmed membership numbers, the proposed annual congregational ministry contribution is \$525 per active confirmed member. Budget is based on staff of Deacon and Parish Administrator and does not include an interim pastor. Budget also includes salary increase for Deacon Tara based on synod guidelines for compensation in multi-point parishes.

Discussion: Keep or sell the TCM van? (Van Expense will be kept in budget and discussed later.) Pulpit supply/Sams – how many worship services are they comfortable with leading each month? Necessity of cooperation among the congregations in worship scheduling.

Motion by Corrina Olson to approved budget as presented. Motion seconded by Janice Johnson and carried.

Special congregational meetings were schedule for Sunday, December 6 to approve the congregational ministry contribution for 2021. (Any congregations worshiping on December 5 would have special meeting following worship.)

**Salary Increase:** Motion by Lori Ellingson, seconded by Paul Motter, that salary increase for Deacon Tara go into effect December 1, 2020. Motion carried.

**NEXT MEETING:** February 2021 after all annual meetings have been held, or as needed.
