It makes my heart glad as people have welcomed me and asked me to come back. We have reminisced, sung songs, prayed together, discussed the weather and farming, or have just sat quietly together. They have encouraged me in my walk with Jesus. One lady tells me that her dad told her the most important thing is to make God the center of your life. What a witness and reminder to me! God can use us to encourage and farther God's kingdom no matter how old we are or the state of our mind. So far, I have visited most people once and half twice, and plan on visiting the people who were added to the list soon. As soon is harvest is over, I plan to try to visit everyone at least once a month.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Minutes of the September 25, 2023, meeting were approved and filed.

OLD BUSINESS

Technology Committee / Grant: The committee is in place and is working to set an initial meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Prayer List / Parish Connections: Discussion of current prayer list and the suggestion of including congregation or relationship to TCM by **each** name; give more mention in the newsletter of the prayer list and procedure for adding names to the list or editing the list.

Parsonage Report: Discussion of the condition of the McVille parsonage and possibility of a contract and deposit if tenant has pets, and necessity of a walk through of the parsonage when tenant moves in and before tenant moves out.

Discussion of financial responsibility for cleaning costs following departure of pastor/deacon/ intern. Motion by Bob Delfs, seconded by Janice Johnson, that Tri-County Ministry pay the professional cleaning costs associated with the McVille parsonage following the departure of Deacon Tara, and that those costs be placed under Miscellaneous Expense. Motion carried. Total cost of professional cleaning was \$1,975.

2024 TCM Budget / Current Finances: Motion by Bob Delfs, seconded by Olen Ophaug that compensation for SAMs / lay pastors be set at \$30 per hour plus mileage, and that the hourly rate include prep time for confirmation classes and drive time for visitation, confirmation classes, meetings and events, all retroactive to October 1, 2023. Motion carried. Motion by Bob Delfs, seconded by Norris Olson, to approve the 2024 budget as recommended by the Executive Committee. Motion carried.

Motion by Bob Delfs, seconded by Allen Hetland, that the November and December 2023 Congregational Ministry Contributions to Tri-County Ministry be suspended. Motion carried. Motion by Bob Delfs, seconded by Olen Ophaug, that \$20,000 in CDs be purchased using funds from the General Fund. Motion carried.

Special congregational meetings will be held Sunday, November 5, 2023, in each congregation to approve the 2024 Congregational Ministry Contributions.

Marla Larson – Officiated at the committal service for Pam Standal. Has begun visitation and plans to do visits monthly.

Truley Trautman – Has led one confirmation class in both McVille and Binford, with a total of six students. Theresa Fiebiger volunteered to be at Trinity during confirmation classes there. The SAMs are registered for the Vital Churches discussion in Cooperstown on October 26, and for the SAM retreat on November 4 in Valley City.

Theresa Fiebiger – Asked that each congregation set their Christmas Eve service time and their annual meeting date by November 15.

Trinity – Committal service for Pam Standal was held. Quilting has begun. Sunday School meets every other week. Pony Express will begin shortly.

Faith of Hannaford – Received a special offering for the Griggs County Central weekend backpack program.
