From Pastor Sherri

"A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."

--.John 4:7

Anyone who has been around the Eastern North Dakota Synod for a while knows what vital ministry has been taking place over the past 28 years at Tri-County Ministry. Serving the wider church beyond our communities does not always receive the recognition that it deserves because we focus on the daily life of ministry together. From our inception, the foundation was laid for ecumenical, multi-point parishes across the ELCA and PCUSA. But there is so much more! Pastors and even a new Bishop-Elect have been Baptized and shaped in our congregations. We have trained many Pastoral Interns that are serving in Eastern ND and beyond this synod and presbytery. Our Lay Preachers and Synod-Authorized Ministers (SaMs) have been steadily serving the parish in worship leadership, preaching, and leading in many other ways. Recently calling a Deacon to join the leadership team shows that we trust that ministry continues to evolve and take new forms. And can I mention that you have helped to shape me? A pastor that will soon serve a church in Norway through Global Missions? I am humbled by your faithful service to our neighbors and your faithful service to the wider church.

When we are open to God's movements among us, we never know where God's call will lead us. But we know that God's Spirit will continue to guide us.

Jesus encounters the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. He sees her and knows her. A tired, thirsty, living, breathing Jesus sees and engages her in theological conversation about water that will guench her thirst. Never be thirsty again? This woman has been through a lot in her life so she is tough and resourceful. We notice that she is at the well at an unusual time. What is she hiding? She knows the religious traditions—this Jewish Rabbi is not supposed to talk to her—and yet, she engages Jesus at every part of the conversation.

We need a God like this right now. Immanuel—God with us—in the flesh. Jesus who sees us and knows us. A Jesus that sees the things we want to hide. Jesus who knows our every failure and weakness and still seeks us out. Jesus who has living water to quench our thirst.

We are the ones that are thirsty and weary. Weary of the pandemic and social unrest. Thirsty for a more certain future. Weary of trying to be church in a changing world. "Jesus, do you see us? Jesus, do you know our situation?"

The woman left her water jar at the well because what she seeks is Jesus' living water. SHE is now the living container from which the water gushes. Jesus sees us and knows us. Take a big gulp, dear sisters and brothers and siblings in Christ! We drink the living water and let go of our jars. The living Jesus encounters us in our daily lives so that WE become his vessels. May we be open to God's baptismal waters moving through our lives and communities so that others may drink the living water that Jesus gives.

"We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life." – Prayer during Holy Baptism. (We then welcome the newly baptized into the body of Christ and into the mission that we share.)

Synod Assembly Report

The weekend of August 14-16, voting members of the Eastern North Dakota synod met in a digital assembly. We elected a new Bishop - Rev. Tessa Moon Leiseth (who grew up at our very own McVille Lutheran). We heard from ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton. We celebrated ordination and church anniversaries. Pastor Russ Pollock from McVille was honored for his 50 years of service and Pastor Nels Lillejord (former pastor at McVille/Our Savior's) was honored for 60 years. We also celebrated the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women, the 40th anniversary of the ordination of the first women of color and the 10th anniversary of the ordination of LGBTQIA+ individuals. In the video shared to celebrate this historic anniversary, there were at least four pastors who interned and were shaped by Tri-County Ministry: Amy Kippen, Trichelle Kirchenwitz, Jule Ballinger, and Bonnie Weaver.

In electing Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth, the Eastern ND synod elected its first female Bishop---a historic day for the church. Bishop Elect Leiseth has a wide grasp of the church having served as the country coordinator in South Africa for Young Adults in Global Mission, serving as a parish pastor and at Concordia College.

Long-range Scheduling

Last year at this time, our congregations/councils/session were scheduling events for the next 12 months. Having a longrange calendar worked very well for staff and for all organizations. Could such a thing happen again?

Yes, we're in a different time now that last year. However, if councils/session could schedule their meetings, and if organizations could make tentative plans for such things as church suppers and Christmas programs, we'd have a good head start on the next 12 months.

From Deacon Tara

"Do not be afraid." These words have been playing in my heart and mind in the last months, weeks, and days. At one time, it was brought to my attention that these words appear 365 times in Scripture — once for every day of the year. I find such comfort in hearing these words because fear has a way of paralyzing us. Yet God continually reminds us that God will never leave us or forsake us.

In the early days of the pandemic, I will admit that fear often would find its way into my heart and mind. However, as we have learned more about how to protect ourselves and most especially, protect our neighbors, I have found peace and am no longer paralyzed as easily by fear. Yet there are some who think we are letting fear motivate our actions, but that is not it at all. We are simply loving and caring for our neighbors. We do not want someone to come to worship and become sick with the virus. The truth is that as leaders we are called to care for and protect the most vulnerable among us.

A few weeks ago, Pastor Sherri shared about the difficulties of serving the church during a pandemic. It's true! There are people on all ends of the spectrum: (1) We are either being too cautious or (2) We are not being cautious enough. As a result, it does your leaders, the church or even yourselves no good to compare our actions to other area churches. They are caring for their people the best they know how. And we are caring for our people the best we know how.

Too often we let the comparison game get in the way of loving, serving and caring for our neighbor. It is important to me, as a daughter whose mom lives in a nursing home, to be as careful as we can be. I trust that God is with us during this pandemic. But I also know that we can take precautions to help prevent the spread of this virus to the vulnerable among us. For me, it is about loving my neighbor so that we are both protected. It is about loving all God's people even when we may not agree about a certain issue. It is about knowing and clinging to the fact that God loved us so much God sent God's one and only Son into the world for each and every one of us.

"This is how much God loved the world: God gave God's Son, God's one and only Son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in him, anyone can have a whole and lasting life. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending God's Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again." (John 3:16-1; The Message Translation)
